of national publishers. He is a Civil War re-enactor with the 26th Regiment of North Carolina Troops, the same regiment that Zebulon Vance commanded at the beginning of the war.

His Norris Pig Dinner talk focused on what Zebulon Vance accomplished with his life, starting with his experience at the University of North Carolina and Phi Gamma Delta.
