
the international level. We are truly proud of all Marvin has accomplished and sincerely appreciate the leadership, enthusiasm and loyalty he shared with the fraternity.

## Nearly 60 Years After Graduation, This Phi Gam Knows the Value of Brotherhood and Lifelong Friendship

### What Started as a Small Get-Together, Dixie Green '48 Helped Evolve Phi Gam Gathering into an Ever-Growing Annual Reunion

In 2000, **Dixie Green '48** and seven other brothers decided to meet after many years apart. Six years later, it has become a much-anticipated annual reunion, drawing over 100 brothers together to reminisce and catch up with old friends.

#### What attracted you to Phi Gam?

I developed an interest in Phi Gam because I liked the guys in there and there were a lot from eastern North Carolina. It's all about meeting friends and being influenced by good people and relationships.

#### Did you live in the house? If so, who were your roommates? Tell us about a memorable time with them.

I lived in the house for about three years. My roommate was **Robin Hicks**. Robin and I would take a break from studying and go on the side of the DKE house and play ping pong at one in the morning, and pretty soon one of those DKE brothers would open up a window and say, "You damn Phi Gams, get to bed!"

#### What other activities or organizations were you involved with during your college days?

After you join a fraternity, you go through a process before you're initiated. They told me I had to do something extracurricular...and I joined the glee club. They put me in the second bass section, and there I stood next to Andy Griffith, [who] was attending Chapel Hill and got his degree there. He wasn't a big celebrity at the time. We had an annual contest for best singing among the fraternities, and we had a good time.

# *Tell us about a vivid memory on campus.*

When the war ended, you couldn't possibly have any classes because everyone else was out living it up. People took all of the furniture out of the administration building and had a bonfire almost big enough to fill up a football field! There was another one out by the Beta house, but not as big.

# Do you have a favorite memory with a Big/Little Brother?

I remember **Bill Hedrick '51** rushing... and he showed up with purple shoes on. I was afraid he'd get blackballed by wearing those purple shoes. His sponsor was **Bill Raker '49**, an extremely wonderful person and dear friend. I told Bill Raker to tell Bill Hedrick not to show up with those purple shoes on if he wanted to make it into the fraternity. So he wore white ones instead that were very appropriate at the time. Later in life, Bill Hedrick was able to do a similar turn for another fellow.

#### How did the reunions come about?

It was just by happenstance. My dear fraternity brother Bill Hedrick always went to Wrightsville Beach with his family and spent a week, and around March 2000 he said he'd like to ride up with **Billy Quarles '52** and **Brad Cantwell '52**, and he suggested I join them, and we'd have lunch at the Greenville

Country Club in early May 2000. It was eight of us that had that first meeting: Billy Quarles, Brad Cantwell, Bill Hedrick, Joe Nelson '53, Nick Boddie '51, Mayo Boddie, Ben Yelverton '51, and myself. We just enjoyed being with each other since our break in 1952. As 2001 approached, we decided to do it again, and the second one in May 2001 had 34 people. We had a great reception from

Greenville because it was such an unusual thing. We brought in 65 the third time. The fourth time was 96, then 112 this past May.

The fun of the thing is getting these friends together. Who would ever think that people would be so responsive to a thing like this so late in life? It gives them something to look forward to. A lot of people can't believe all these people take the time to go to a fraternity reunion. But they're not us, you know.

# What is it like to reunite with brothers you haven't seen for years?

One of the many sidelights to these reunions... was when a brother walked into the country club, and those already having arrived had a heck of a time trying to figure out who that person really was. It was **Dussy Woodberry** of Savannah, Georgia, who once looked very similar to Alan Ladd of 1950s stardom, and the fellows thought he was Aristotle Onassis. Most everybody had not seen Dussy for 50 to 55 years. It was truly hilarious.

#### Tell us about your family.

I have three sons. They're now 45, 41, and 35. The oldest one is in the automobile business, as I was, in Atlantic Beach/Morehead City, NC. My middle son is with a large pharmaceutical manufacturing business here in Greenville. My youngest is a mortgage broker and is also in the real estate business.

#### What hobbies do you enjoy?

My three sons have boats. Sometimes all three sons' families go... down to Atlantic Beach/ Morehead on weekends and we cruise out to Shackleford Banks, an island, and we pick a very pretty strand and go in and picnic. It has wild horses on it that the grandchildren love to see.
